Exercise on Digital Documents (2.5%)

- 1. Examine (maybe even install and play with) at least two of the following free and open source word processors onto your computer:

 - Libre Office (<u>https://www.libreoffice.org/discover/writer/</u>)
 - GNU TeXmacs (<u>http://texmacs.org/tmweb/home/welcome.en.html</u>)

 - another color other than black or the previously done color
 - one internal reference link (a link to another part of the page)
